Dear Sir/Madam,

I am a resident of Stonetown Terrace adjoining the Cleeves Site and have some observations/questions regarding the retention of some of the historically important elements contained within the site. I have studied the Development Plan online and note the following;

1. RPS City number 3264 NIAH Reg No 21512053 correctly lists the former Golden Vale chimney stack. Is this to be restored to its former height?
2. RPS City number 3265 NIAH Reg No 21512059 incorrectly lists former Golden Vale chimney stack whilst showing a picture of the iconic former flax mill building. Can you please confirm that the flax building is a protected structure.
3. I note the absence from the Protected Structure list of the following elements on this site;
 - a). The derelict cottages at the top of Stonetown Terrace
 - b). The cut stone wall at the perimeter of the site particularly the Stonetown Terrace Section.
 - c). Other 19th century buildings on the site.

Would you please be so good as to clarify these five items for me at your earliest convenience.
