Existing accesses and services as per agreements made with and permitted by the Local Authority to facilitate development of your lands in Ballykeeffe and Bunlicky

Dear Michael,

In relation to the above I confirm that your files dating back to 1996 have been retained and referenced in this letter. I confirm that the lands are serviced with onsite manholes, connections or drains as appropriate for surface water and foul sewer services. There are accesses provided for all vehicles types already installed at two locations.

We are attaching herewith a <u>sample</u> record of documentation from our files confirming the preparedness of your land for development purposes.

The entrance off the N69 at Bunlicky was granted Planning Permission under Reference Number 04/372 in 2004 and constructed by you. Copy of Planning Permission and layout drawing attached marked with the letter A.

This entrance formed a key junction which provided the opportunity to serve adjoining zoned lands. Joined up thinking between landowners was actively encouraged by the Senior Planner who facilitated a meeting at the offices of the Local Authority in 2010. In this regard we attach herewith letter dated 18th May 2010 (marked with the letter B) and it is particularly important to note that the area is referred to as a Special Development Node.

The Southern Environs Local Area Plan (2011-2017 and extended to 2021) indicated the junction from the N69 playing a key role in the interconnectivity with other lands from the Ballinaclogh River to the east right out to Moore's Lane to the west and the lands were zoned Enterprise and Employment, and Industrial with a fringe of semi-natural open space adjacent to the Ballinaclogh River. See attached map marked with the letter C.

We would also point out that the entrance off the N69, was intended on the above zoning map to connect to an access on the southern side of the motorway mainline off the Ballykeeffe Boreen.

We would add that agreement was also reached with the Local Authority for the connection of a **foul sewer** from the Bunlicky lands into the foul sewer in the Recycling Centre. This connection is insitu. See attached letter dated 22nd December 2005 marked with the letter D.

Agreements (as outlined in attached letter dated 22nd April 2004 marked with the letter E) were made with the Local Authority. These included the installation of surface water and foul sewer connections within your lands providing easy access to these for development purposes. Please refer to drawings marked with the letters F and G respectively. In relation to access, Item 1 in that letter relates to the entrance onto the realigned Ballykeeffe Boreen which has been provided. This is designed to cater for all vehicle types including heavy goods vehicles on the southern side of the motorway mainline off the Ballykeeffe Boreen. See attached drawing marked with the letter H.

The Local Authority undertook to take cognisance of hydrological studies undertaken by Limerick City Council and Limerick County Council in order to provide positive drainage solutions where possible. This has been appropriately dealt with and access to surface water drainage is also available within your lands — Reference Item 4 in letter dated 22nd April 2004 and drawing marked with the letter F referred to above.

Item 8 deals with foul sewer drainage which states that a foul sewer branch will be provided into the retained land from manhole F703 as indicated on Figure UT003 in Volume 3 (Geometric drawings) of the EIS. This too has been attended and we attach drawing of same marked with the letter I.

This office, other hydrological and planning experts have advised throughout the years and made various submissions to Limerick County Council (now Limerick City and County Council). The entire team have always remained cognisant and respectful of climate change and associated hydrological challenges.

This office, with the support of other expert advisors remains convinced that engineering solutions can be designed for all hydrological challenges in the area. Any planning application will require comprehensive detailed design to ensure that society and the local community is served ethically and not put at risk.

The motorway and the tunnel beneath the River Shannon have been constructed with infrastructure to protect the tunnel and neighbouring lands and similar consideration can and will be given to your lands if appropriate zoning as requested in the HRA submission supported by the Punch hydrological report is granted.

In considering the Manager's Report we would ask all Council members to consider the fact that the land is well serviced with accesses and utilities. The lands are in a good state of preparedness to facilitate development.

Our records show that you have been diligent in ensuring that the lands are properly serviced and prepared for development at this key nodal location as envisaged by the Local Authority for many years.

We would invite the Councillors to consider the lost opportunity to Limerick City and County if these lands surrounding a key nodal point are not appropriately zoned for the development of Limerick City and County. We would encourage the Councillors to visualise key development in this area that is in keeping with an area that is successful, thriving and provides an enjoyable place for people to work and live. Such development would be in full view of potential investors as they arrive from Shannon Airport at this gateway location on the National Primary Road Network at the entrance to Limerick city.

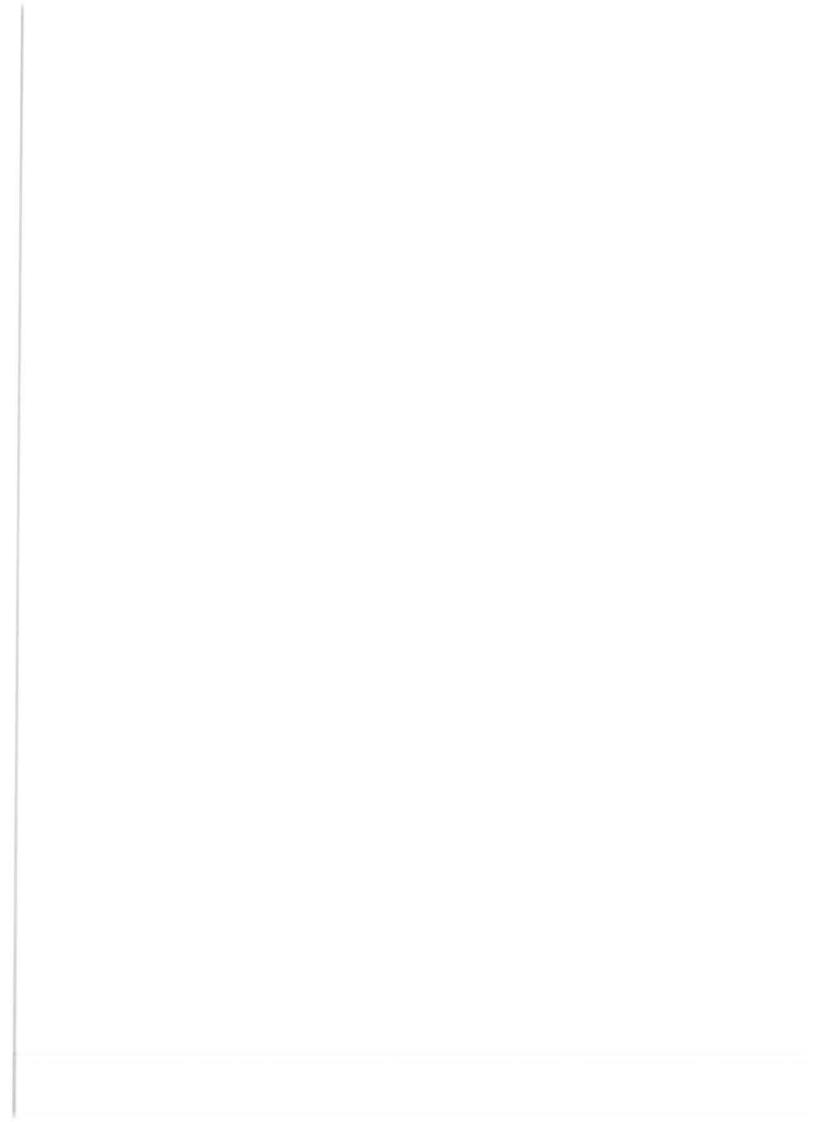

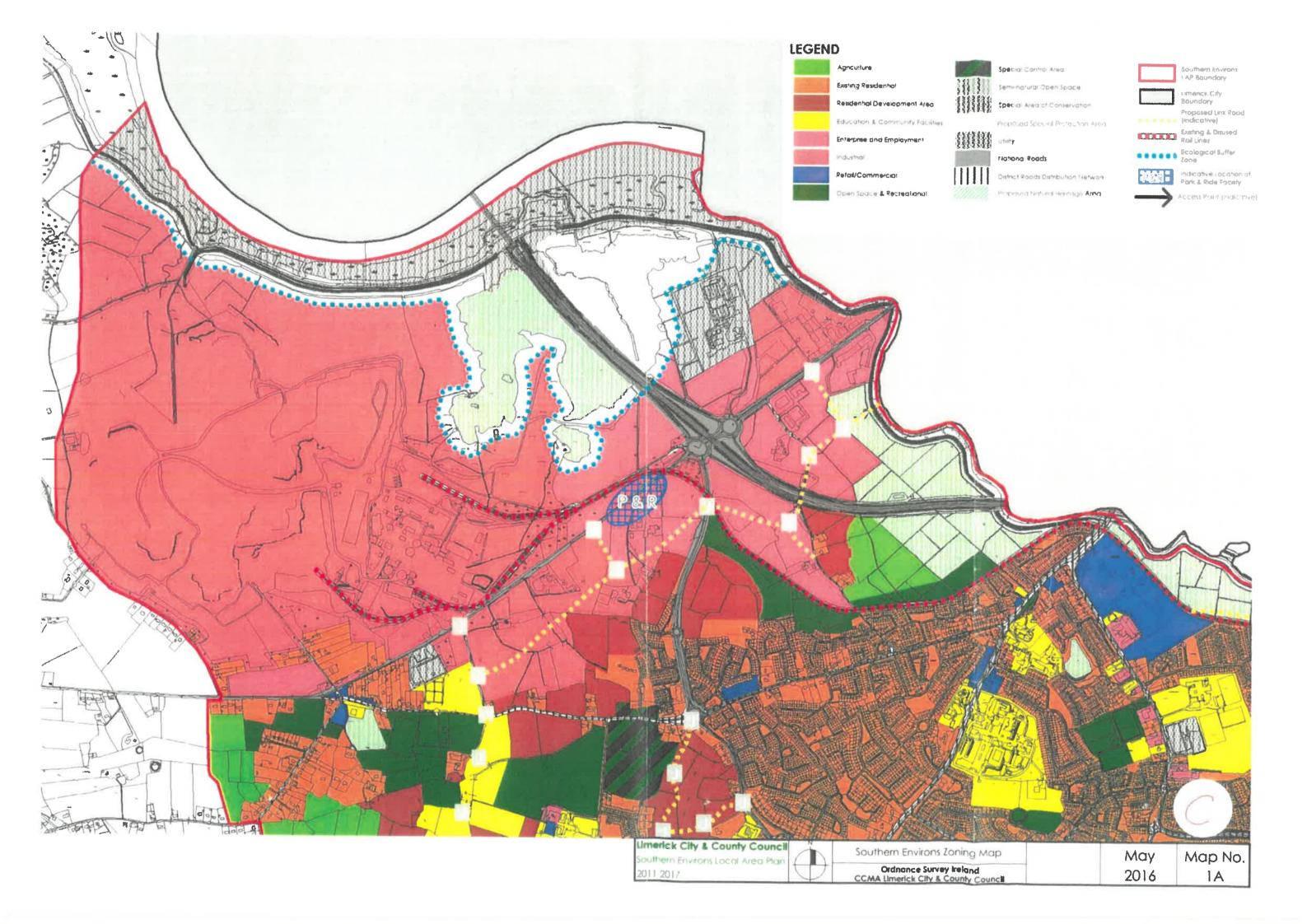
The following agenda has been proposed;

Re: Proposed sewers for Recycling Centre and Dog Pound, Mungret - Wayleave Notices

Dear Sir,

Further to our letter on the above dated 8th June, 2005, I enclose an amended Wayleave Notice which corrects the address of lands owned by you from Skehacregguan to Bunlicky, County Limerick. This Wayleave Notice supersedes the previous one issued.

It is proposed to now proceed to construction in January, 2006, and in this regard, I am enclosing a statutory wayleave notice and accompanying map to enable the sewers to be laid over your land, which, it is understood, are owned by you.

The Council will pay compensation at the rate of €21.27 per linear metre plus €560.00 per chamber giving a total compensation of £6146.70. Payment can only be made, of course, on the production of adequate title to the property.

The council agrees to permit a connection to Manhole MHF100, shown on attached plan SK003/P1.

The Council will endeavour to ensure that the reinstatement works will be carried out to the highest standards. However, should additional damage occur, you will be entitled to seek compensation for any loss which, in default of agreement, will be determined by arbitration as provided for in the Sanitary Services Acts.

WAYLEAVE NOTICE

WHEREAS the County Council of the County of Limerick, the Sanitary Authority for the said County, having offices at County Hall, Dooradoyle, Limerick (hereinafter called "the Council") propose, for the purpose of effectually draining the sanitary district comprising the County of Limerick and in particular for the purpose of carrying out the construction works under a scheme entitled Mungret Recycling centre and Dog Pound, to construct sewers within their district under virtue of the powers vested in the Council under section 18 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878 and in pursuance of every other power in that behalf them enabling.

AND WHEREAS for the purposes of constructing the said sewers it is necessary to carry the sewers into, through or under certain lands hereinafter referred to owned or occupied by you situate at Bunlicky, Mungret, County Limerick.

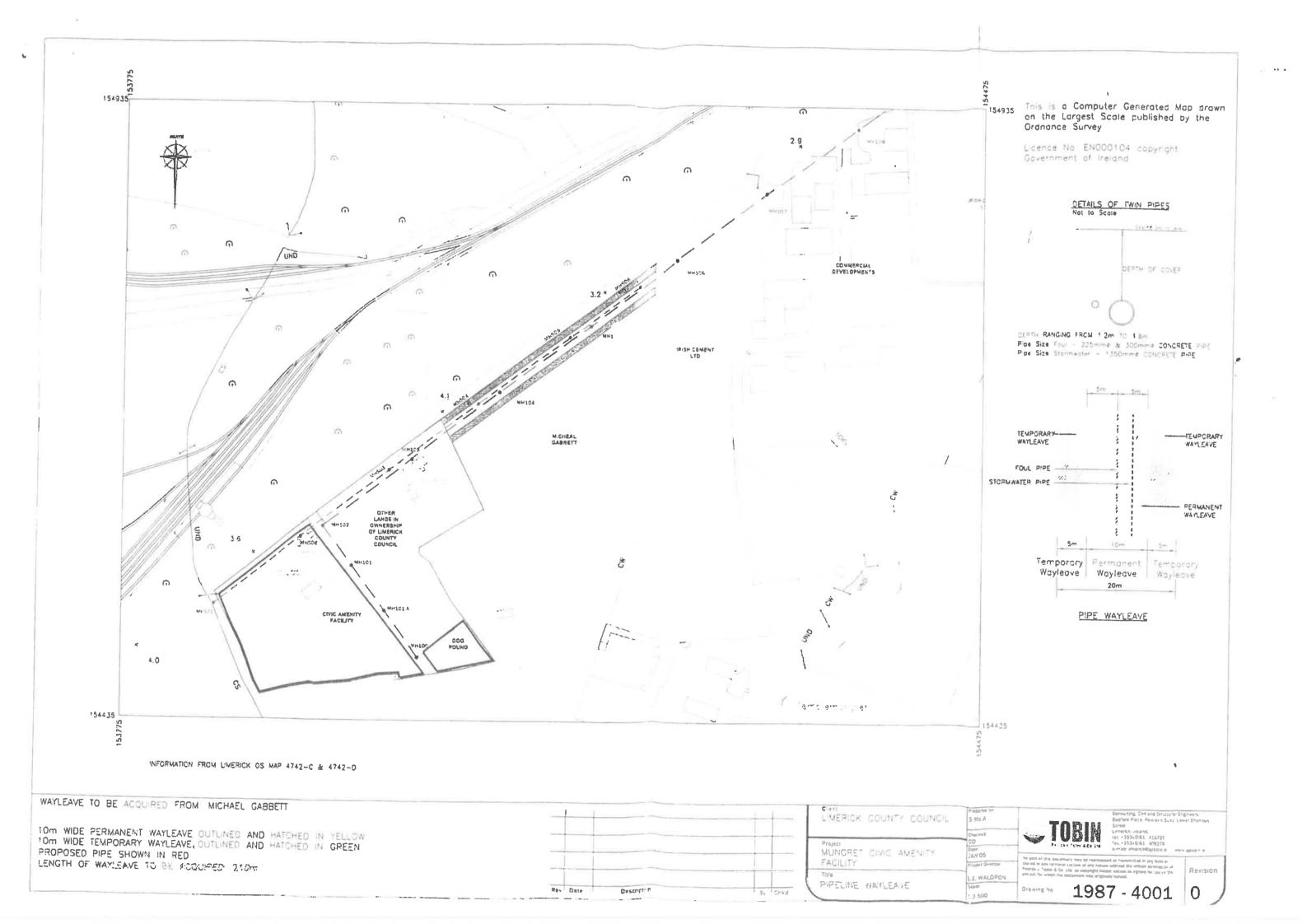
NOW THEREFORE TAKE NOTICE that the Council hereby give notice in accordance with Section 18 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 that they, or their agents or Contractors, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act and in pursuance of every other power them enabling, at some time after the expiration of fourteen days form the date of service of this Notice, or on the first opportunity thereafter, will enter upon the said lands and will uproot the soil thereof and do all said acts and things as may be necessary to lay and construct sewers and manholes, valves, controls and fittings as indicated on the map attached hereto and extending over a length of 210 meters.

The Wayleave necessary for the construction of the said sewers and the Wayleave necessary for the maintenance of the said sewers are indicated on the map hereto drawing number 1987-4001.

Further to our meeting today in the Kilmurry Lodge Hotel and further to my letter dated Toth April 2004 and 21st April 2004, we confirm as follows:

1. Access: The Council will provide access to the retained lands to the south of the proposed mainline by means of an entrance onto the realigned Ballykeeffe Boreen as shown in the Council's access drawing.

The Council will construct the entrance to the C.P.O. boundary.

The Council will continue the 2m wide footpath from the southern end of the proposed bridge to the C.P.O. boundary along the entrance. The access has been designed to cater for all vehicle types including heavy goods vehicles.

2. Overpass: The Council will provide a cattle pass on the western side of the proposed Ballykeeffe Boreen overbridge to facilitate stock movement between the land parcels. The details of such are shown on Figure BR-006 in Volume 3 of the E.I.S.

Telephone: 061-227382 Fax: 061-226259 a mail intellimidence on the 3. Rock Breaking/Blasting: Where rock breaking is to take place in the vicinity a pre-works survey will be carried out and vibration monitors installed.

This relates to the residential building and adjoining farm building located to the north of the proposed mainline. A pre-works survey of the underground slurry tanks subject to the landowner emptying same prior to inspection will be included. The programming of this to be agreed with the landowner.

4. Drainage: Existing drainage of the retained lands not to be impaired and not to result in any additional flooding as a consequence of the proposed works. Detailed drainage design will be carried out during detailed design stage. Your client's concerns regarding existing drainage problems in the catchment is noted. In recent years Limerick County Council and Limerick City Council have undertaken hydrological studies and capital drainage works on the catchment your client's land is within. The detailed drainage design will take cognisance of these studies in order to provide positive drainage solutions where possible.

Consultation on land drainage will take place with individual landowners at detailed design stage.

- 5. Landscaping: Your client will be consulted during landscaping design on landscaping issues.
- 6. Water (Stock): The Council will stress to the contractor the need not to disturb the function of the existing water courses/mains with the intention of maintaining the current water quality for stock consumption purposes.

Because of the nature of the works at the Ballykeeffe road bridge an alternative water supply from the vicinity of the Dock Road will be provided to the Gabbett retained property prior to commencement of the works.

- 7. <u>Temporary Disturbance</u>: All temporary fencing to be stock proof and maintained by the contractor. Temporary access across the proposed mainline will be provided and maintained in a functional condition during construction.
- 8. Foul Sewer Drainage: A foul sewer branch will be provided into the retained land from manhole F703 as indicated on Figure No. UTT-003 in Volume 3 (Geometric Drawings) of the E.L.S.
- 9. Access to the eastern side of Ballykeeffe Boreen: The Council will provide an access into the retained lands from service road no. 1 (indicated on Figure No. GE-02) in Volume 3 (Geometric Drawings) of the E.I.S. provided this is agreed with the adjoining landowners. A gate will also be provided on the Ballykeeffe Boreen if required by the landowners.
- 10. Accommodation Works: A fuller discussion/negotiation will take place at the appropriate time in relation to accommodation works.
