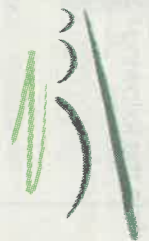

PUBLIC NOTICE

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENTS ACTS 2000 (AS AMENDED) PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS 2001 (AS AMENDED) PART 8 DEVELOPMENT

In accordance with Part XI of the Planning and Development Acts 2000 (as amended) and Part 8, Article 81 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended) notice is hereby given that the Roads, Traffic & Cleansing Department of Limerick City and County Council proposes to carry out the following development commencing West of N69 Clarina Roundabout Ballybrown, to, L-1403 Junction Bricklodge, Door.

- The development works will consist of:
- Extension of the existing embankment on the landowner's side.
 - Construction of a shared raised footpath and cycleway, with a macadam-finished surface. The shared path will extend from the roundabout and continue around the bend onto the L-1403 local road.
 - Provision of an uncontrolled crossing on the L-1403 at the end of the proposed footway
 - Fencing along walkway with timber posts and tensioned mesh fencing on the land-owner's side
 - Relocation of the existing open drain where required, and piping under access ways into private property.
 - Minor repair works to the N69/L-1403 junction.
 - Accommodation works for affected landowners

Limerick City and County Council has carried out an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Screening Report in accordance with the Roads Act 1993 (S.I. No 14 of 1993) as amended and has determined that there is no likelihood of significant effects on the environment. Accordingly, it has been determined that EIA is not required in respect of this proposed development. Nonetheless, a person may within 4 weeks from the date of the notice, apply to An Bord Pleanála for a screening determination. Such a submission should be addressed to the Secretary, An Bord Pleanála, 64 Marlborough Street, Dublin 1.

Limerick City and County Council has carried out Appropriate Assessment (AA) Screening Report and has determined that a full Appropriate Assessment is not required in respect of this proposed development.

COMMUNITY RECOGNITION FUND 2023

The Department of Rural and Community Development and Limerick City & County Council invite Expressions of Interest for funding under the Community Recognition Fund 2023.

This major initiative, the first of its kind, is designed to specifically support communities across the county that have welcomed families and citizens from Ukraine and / or International Protection Applicants.

The scheme details set out that only areas which have high levels of new arrivals will be deemed eligible for this scheme. In Limerick, areas with the highest numbers are locations in the Limerick City and Urban Suburbs, Ardagh, Bruff, Cappanore, Castleconnell, Clarina/Ballybrown, Foynes, Glín, Kildimo, Kilmallock, Kiltinane & Pallaskey.

The fund aims to support the development of facilities that will be used in the future by all members of the community.

Limerick City and County Council is seeking expressions of interest (EOI) for project proposals from community groups in the areas listed above.

This fund is for capital costs only – Operational Costs/salaries/programs will not be eligible.

The EOI has two categories available for possible types of projects that can be funded under the scheme.

Category (1) covering Capital Works above €5,000 for the following:

- The refurbishment of local sports clubs and facilities
- The upgrade of community facilities such as play areas, walkways, parks and community gardens
- The enhancement of school or parish facilities that are open to the wider community after hours or on weekends
- Transport infrastructure such as community vehicles and bus shelters

All elements regarding Category (1) projects must be 60% completed in full and expended by 30th September 2023.

Category (2) covering equipment to a maximum value of €4,999 for the following:

- The purchase of equipment to benefit local clubs, festivals, music and arts organisations.

All elements regarding Category (2) projects must be completed and expended by 30th August 2023.

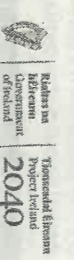

N/M20 CORK TO LIMERICK - PROJECT UPDATE

Limerick City and County Council is progressing the development of the N/M20 Cork to Limerick project in partnership with Cork County Council, Cork City Council, Transport Infrastructure Ireland and the Department of Transport. The project is a priority investment in the Government's National Development Plan 2021-2030.

Limerick City and County Council published the N/M20 Preferred Transport Solution in March 2022, following the conclusion of the Phase 2 Options Selection process. That solution is not limited to consideration of a single mode of transport but is based upon a holistic, multi-modal view to improving connectivity, safety, and economic links between the cities of Cork and Limerick, and ultimately Galway. The project team have continued to progress the development of the N/M20 Cork to Limerick project and are currently progressing Phase 3 Design and Environmental Evaluation.

Following consideration of extensive feedback received from the public and of evolving climate, environmental and transport policy, a project update has been published on the following elements:

- The provision of 80km of Active Travel Infrastructure for walking and cycling, enhancing the health and wellbeing of our communities and making them more accessible and attractive for everyone.
- The Junction Strategy, with nine (9) no. junction locations identified which will provide connectivity with the communities of Blarney, Rathduff, Mourneabbey, Mallow, Buttevant, Charleville, Brurea, and Coom and connecting with the national road network at Aylfinn near Patrickswell.
- The provision of Mobility Hubs at the junctions with secure parking, EV charging, effective active travel and public transport linkages to nearby communities, offering greater travel choice and modal change opportunities.
- Opportunities to enhance Public Transport and encourage transfer to bus and rail.
- The Alternative Grey Area at Ballyhea has been removed from the study area, and
- An Alternative Grey Area at Rathduff has been included in the study area for consideration.

Further details and maps on the project update are available on the project website www.corklimerick.ie and from the N/M20 Project Office in Lissarrilla House, Dooradoyle, Limerick, V94 H5RR. Property owners and other stakeholders within the study area were notified by post of this update. The project team continues to welcome feedback from property owners, communities, businesses and other stakeholders. The project team will continue to progress the design and environmental evaluation of the project with further updates scheduled in 2023.
