In accordance with Part XI of the (Planning and Development Acts) 2000 (as amended) and Part 8, Article 81 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended), notice is hereby given that Limerick City & County Council proposes to carry out the following development at Castle Oaks View, Southhill, Limerick.

The development will consist of: the construction of a new play area including all necessary site works, associated boundary treatment and provision of drainage and lighting. The works will include preparation of the site, installation of a range of play equipment, a protective perimeter, safety surfacing, tree and shrub planting, site furniture and the construction of a new uncontrolled pedestrian crossing.

Limerick City & County Council has carried out an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Screening Report in accordance with the requirements of Article 120(1B)(b)(i) and has determined that there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment. Accordingly, it has been determined that EIA is not required in respect of this development. In accordance with Part XI of the Planning and Development Acts 2000 (as amended) and Part 8, Article 81 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended), notice is hereby given that the Roads, Traffic & Cleansing Department of Limerick City and County Council proposes to carry out the following development works at the Junction of the N69 & L-6005 at Ballyengland Lower.

The development works will consist of

- Existing boundary wall/hedgerows to the east of the Junction to be set back. The existing boundary will be replaced with T11 approved fencing. This will involve the procurement of private lands.
- Minor realignment of the existing L-6005 / N69 junction.
- Realigning and setting back the ditch to the west of the junction, including relocation of existing farm gated access and piping of open drain. The existing boundary will be replaced with T11 approved fencing.
- Accommodation works for affected landowners
- Upgrading of signage and existing road markings associated with the proposed Junction.
